
Why join the Guild?

Our printed newsletter is published four times a year. Posted to all members, it is also available from our website. It contains Guild news (events, exhibitions we attended, regional meetings and details of competitions). It also usually contains a pattern or two, and some interesting techniques for you to try!



We also have an online journal – **Beyond the Gate Pegs** – which is only available to members from our website. Published three times a year, it contains information about Guild events, as well as hints, tips and patterns.

On the Members area of our website, you will find information about the Guild's activities, and resources associated with 'workshops' covering topics ranging from decorative raglan shaping, to hairpin lace and felting.



Help and support

The support and encouragement you get from being part of a like-minded group of people is invaluable. Members have access to an online discussion group, and can contact the helpline by phone or by email. If you need more help, the Guild tries to put you in touch with a 'knitting buddy' - an experienced knitter who may be able to help you.
